

Juvenile Justice Sites & JJ Partners

- Partners include juvenile justice and community behavioral health services organizations include:
 - 1) District of Columbia (1 site)
 - 2) Florida (2 sites)
 - 3) Georgia (6 sites)
 - 4) Kentucky (6 sites)
 - 5) Mississippi (6 sites)
 - 6) New York (6 sites)
 - 7) Pennsylvania (3 sites)
 - 8) Texas (6 sites)

JJ-TRIALS

Planned JJ-TRIALS Sites

- All sites (n = 36) serve youth under community
 - Sites are primarily county level juvenile justice agencies
 - Site are predominantly urban (some suburban, rural, and mixed sites however)
- Annually an estimated 33,000 youth are served across all

JJ-TRIALS

Site Selection Criteria

- To participate in the study, all sites had to meet the following criteria:
 - Be a juvenile justice agency service justice-involved youth under community supervision and receiving services in non-secured settings
 - Able to provide data on youth's involvement in behavioral health services, including screening, assessment, and treatment initiation
 - Able to partner with at least 1 behavioral health treatment partner outside of JJ agency
 - Minimum caseflow of 10 youth/month
 - Minimum of 8 staff members in JJ agency
 - Ability to designate senior staff to serve as study liaison

- JJ-TRIALS juvenile justice partners are voting members of the Steering Committee and attend every SC meeting

 - Participate in workgroups (including primary Study Design group)
 - Advise on key design issues at every juncture
 - Review and comment on study procedures & documents
 - Assist in recruiting/securing potential study sites
 - Co-author public presentations
